IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM MR ELLIS.

Dear Parents

'Mini' shin guards are now being worn by some professional players in football and we have recently had some students asking if they would be allowed to wear them in school PE lessons and football fixtures.

The English Football Association and the UK PE Association have made statements that 'mini' shin guards are not advised as they give much reduced protection from injury to the lower legs compared to standard sized shin guards. We are therefore strongly advising all students to wear standard sized shin guards. For those students who would like to wear 'mini' shin guards, we would ask their parents to write an email to Mr Ellis giving their consent for their son or daughter to wear 'mini' shin guards and to acknowledge that they offer less protection from injury.


