

Whole School Focus on Uniform, Appearance & Equipment Starting After Half-Term

As we return from the half-term break, we will be reinforcing our school's uniform and appearance expectations to ensure all students take pride in their presentation. We appreciate the support of parents and carers in maintaining these standards, which help foster a sense of belonging, discipline, and readiness for learning.

To clarify our expectations:

- ☑ Hair All students with long hair (excluding Year 11) must have their hair tied up.
 - ✓ Skirts Skirts must be worn at an appropriate length, just above the knee, and should not be rolled up.
- ✓ Make-up Only students in Years 10 and above are permitted to wear subtle and natural-looking makeup.
- ✓ Uniform Jumpers and Blazers (and Ties for Boys) must be worn throughout the day
- ✓ Equipment All senior students **Must** bring to school adequate stationery for all lessons (pens, pencils, rulers, scientific calculator).
 - ✓ Water Bottles All students **Must** bring in their own water bottle.

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
