Thank you once again to our students, parents, and staff for making Brookes such a wonderful place to learn and grow. We look forward to a successful and inspiring term ahead!





#### Whole School Focus on Uniform, Appearance & Equipment Starting After Half-Term

As we return from the half-term break, we will be reinforcing our school's uniform and appearance expectations to ensure all students take pride in their presentation. We appreciate the support of parents and carers in maintaining these standards, which help foster a sense of belonging, discipline, and readiness for learning.

#### To clarify our expectations:

- Hair All students with long hair (excluding Year 11) must have their hair tied up.


